Questions for Reflection: In Luke 15:1-10, Jesus tells the parable of the shepherd who seeks out one lost sheep and a woman who searches her home for a missing coin. Is there someone from whom you are estranged, a distant friend or family member, or a person from your church you haven't seen in a while If appropriate, find a way to contact that person and let them know you have missed them.

Morning Prayer: O Lord, have mercy on us this day according to your steadfast love. Create clean hearts and new spirits within us and open our lips to declare your praise; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

Evening Prayer: Tonight, O God, we give you thanks for your grace overflowing in our lives and for the gifts of faith and love in Christ. Strengthen us for your service, be patient with us in our failings, and continue to pour out your mercy upon us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

HUNGER MINISTRY: OCTOBER 15 PACKING EVENT AT FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

As a Christian nonprofit organization, Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) is called to feed God's starving children hungry in body and spirit. From FMSC's website: "Every year, millions of children die from preventable causes such as pneumonia, diarrhea, malaria and undernutrition. Hunger is still causing nearly half of deaths in children under 5 years old. From this data, we estimate at least 6,200 children die each day from causes related to undernutrition. This is heartbreaking." Through late August 2022, FMSC has sent meals to 56 countries, including 2.75 million meals to Ukraine. FMSC needs help packing meals. To respond to this need, a work event for Esperanza has been scheduled from 11:30 AM to 1:15 PM on Saturday, October 15. This is a great opportunity for our youth to get involved in responding to a global need. Youth 5 and older can participate with an adult. Forty-five work slots have been reserved for Esperanza. FMSC's Phoenix metro packing location is at 1345 S. Alma School Drive, Mesa, 85210. FMSC would also appreciate a

General Fund Results Through August

Budget	\$215,440	\$211,488	\$3,952

Pledge giving was especially strong in August. YTD pledge giving, while somewhat below last year, is well ahead of budget so far this year. But this is due largely to families who have paid ahead or already paid their full annual pledge. Unpledged giving, while bolstered by a large donation from the Preschool, is still somewhat behind Budget.

Thanks to continued focus on cost containment, expenses YTD are less than budget. As a result, YTD Net Income is positive. However, since the favorability in pledge giving will almost certainly decline over the balance of the year, we still expect a net shortfall for the full year, although somewhat less than previously projected.
